Gardening – Wayne Rhoden – Master Gardener program with Texas Agriculture Extension Office

- Master Gardeners volunteer their work and receive free training in return. 2009 – 115 counties had master gardeners. 520,000 hours of volunteer service. Would cost the State of Texas \$10M to provide to this service. Master Gardener started in Williamson County program in 2007. 32,500 calls/year. 2500 programs/year. 153,000 Texans attended programs. 212 demonstration gardens. 2 at Williamson County Inner Loop Office. Maintain 50 web-sites and sponsor a junior master gardener program at schools.

- Master Naturalist group now. Works with environmental groups on conservation and restoration. 46 hours of training. Just had second class. 20 in class.
- Club provided literature on Oak Wilt. Disease transferred by beetles to open wounds in trees and through root systems. White Oak is not susceptible. Red and Live Oak trees should not be trimmed unless painted when trimmed.
- Grasses – 2002 thru 2005 had grass demonstration areas. Different grasses require different treatment. St Augustine is as good as other grasses. Buffalo grass stays alive with less water but doesn't green up as well. Lawn Maintenance – extension web-site = <http://williamson-tx.tamu.edu/>. Remove clippings first time for year. St Augustine should stay 3 inches high. Want 1 inch of water each time. Fertilize to specifications from manufacturers, don't over fertilize. Check out Zoysia grasses. Horse Herb is another local variety.
